


Veronica and Tom Cora and Liara






Hello!

Veronica has gone to a coffee shop nearby every Saturday morning for 8 years, so when the girls were born it seemed only natural to bring them along. They know all of the regulars, many of whom are young families with children. Recently, Veronica met up with two of her sisters for coffee and the girls got to see their cousin Joseph. Even though Veronica and her sisters have a group text that gets used extensively, they still love getting together in person and never seem to run out of things to talk about.





As long as the weather is good, almost every day after dinner we go for a walk and stop at one of the many playgrounds in our neighborhood. The other day at the playground, another little girl kept trying to befriend Cora even though Cora was feeling shy. Eventually Cora warmed up, though, and had so much fun going down the slides with her. Your child would have lots of opportunities to get to know other children in their neighborhood.

Every month we spend a Saturday hosting close friends at our home. We've done bible studies together and right now we're reading a book on parenting and discussing it as a group. Recently, the book we were reading recommended regularly journaling about your child's growth. So we all had a discussion about how we can best observe and take note of where our children are at emotionally, behaviorally and developmentally. Discussion like these have really given us great ideas for how to best parent our children in every stage of growth.



We make fresh bread from freshly milled flour 4-5 days a week! The other day, like usual, Cora was helping Veronica measure and mill the wheat for the flour, and she insisted on mixing the dough together. Cora also asked Veronica to let Liara take a turn mixing the dough, so Veronica helped Liara hold the spoon and showed her how to mix. While Veronica was focused on Liara, Cora grabbed the dough, stuck a glob of it in her mouth and started loudly saying "mmm! mmm!" Veronica told Cora that we can't eat raw dough, but it was hard not to laugh. Your child would grow up finding fun in every moment.



We loved pizza night growing up, so once a week we have pizza, and Veronica makes it from-scratch and tavern style. You can't go wrong with good pizza, so it's a meal we love to share with other people! Recently, Grandma and Grandpa came over to join us! After eating dinner, Grandma and Grandpa took the kids to the park nearby to play. The girls love the park and when they came back they had huge excited smiles about the time spent with Grandpa & Grandma.



Our Big Family

If you chose us your baby would have 2 sets of grandparents, 7 aunts, 4 uncles, and 42 cousins!

One of Tom's favorite memories was the time he was on a fishing trip when he was little, and Tom's mom has retold it to Veronica on multiple occasions because she loves the story so much. Tom caught a big fish and told his dad, but his dad didn't believe he'd actually caught a big one because he had been catching weeds all day thinking they were big fish as well. When Tom pulled his fish in all by himself, his parents were so surprised because typically he would have needed help bringing in such a fish.

Adoption has played a big role in forming our family. Veronica has 4 cousins adopted from Russia and two cousins adopted from Mexico. They were adopted together as a sibling group when Veronica was still young, so she never remembered a time they weren't in her life. Her favorite memory growing up with them was when they would all play at the playground across the street from their cousins' house. As a child, even though Veronica always knew her cousins were adopted, it was so normal to her that it never occurred to her to talk about their adoption with them. They were all far more interested in playing games together as family and friends.



Our family all lives close by, and we have both sets of grandparents a short drive away. It seems like we have family members at one of the grandparents' houses all the time. The other day, Veronica's cousin was at her parents house so we all went over to hang out with her! Her cousin is a birth mother herself, and is also in the process of becoming a foster parent, so we had such a good time catching up with her and her husband and hearing her adoption story. Another time recently, Veronica was dropping off Cora and Liara to be babysat and was surprised to see the girls' aunt and cousin were there as well! Your child would grow up regularly seeing their family.





Our family really looks out for each other. The other day Veronica was talking to her sister, and her sister was telling Veronica that she wished she could meet a guy that cared about people the way our family cares about each other. She reminded Veronica of the time she was having terrible cramps in the night and ran out of Tylenol. A different sister voluntarily got up in the middle of the night to drive 30 minutes one way to get pain medication to her. It really made her appreciate how lucky she was to have our family. Even though there are a lot of people in our family, no ones needs get overlooked, and everyone matters. Your child would grow up with family that wants to know about their struggles and help them through it.

Having many different cultures in our family keeps life fun and interesting! Tom is half Puerto Rican, so we have lots of family from there and some who are still in Puerto Rico. Veronica has a Tanzanian uncle and cousins, an aunt from Germany, and we both have friends from African, east Asian, and Middle Eastern countries. Growing up, Veronica loved learning Swahili words from her cousins. One time in particular, they taught her what all the names in *The Lion King* translated to in Swahili, and then Veronica went to school to show off everything she had learned.

Tom's extended family gets together for Thanksgiving and Christmas eve and it's always a Puerto Rican feast. Tom's mom and aunts start off busy in the kitchen making things like arroz con gandules, empanadas and tostones or salsa while they chat with each other. Veronica enjoys hanging out in the kitchen to watch how they cook everything, and the girls get to play with their cousins. Last Thanksgiving, someone even stopped at a Puerto Rican bakery to pick up guava pastries and coconut pudding, neither of which we had tried before! Every year we have a huge family reunion weekend and the girls get to see all of their first and second cousins! When Cora got home that day she wouldn't stop talking about Abuela and the cookies, and even when we put her to bed that night she was still excitedly telling us about how she had used sprinkles to decorate the cookies. Abuela also keeps a bunch of child-sized aprons at her home so that she can get her grandchildren involved in holiday baking as they get older.

We live in a suburban Illinois home. Veronica's favorite part of our house is our kitchen. It's not as big as we'd prefer, but we've put a lot of work into making it a place where we have all the tools we need. We also have a stool with rails at the counter so that the girls can be with her when she cooks everyday! Tom works as an electrical engineer designing robotic systems. He gets home from work every day at 3:45 so that we can spend long evenings together. Tom gladly got down on the ground and played the game with her before we ate dinner as a family. Your child would get to spend quality time with both of us every single day.

Veronica quit her job after Cora was born to be a **stay at home mom**.
